“*Ulmus* - The Elm Family”

A very unique group of mostly new shade trees, resistant to Dutch Elm beetle. Most are very rapid growers, are all very hardy, and show great promise for the home residence and commercial plantings.

***Ulmus americana* ‘Valley Forge’, VALLEY FORGE ELM (70’ tall x 70’ spread)**

A new American Elm released by the U.S.D.A. National Arboretum in 1995. Upright-arching form. Leaves are a lustrous dark green in summer turning yellow in Fall. Transplants easily, preferring rich, moist soil. Exhibits tolerance to air pollution and poor soil conditions. American Elms are pH tolerant and show good soil salt tolerance. Fast growing trees that adapt to adverse climates. Zones 5-7.

***Ulmus carpinifolia x parvifolia* ‘Frontier’, FRONTIER ELM (40’ tall x 30’ spread)**

An introduction by the U. S. National Arboretum. An elm tree of moderate stature with attractive red fall color. Small to intermediate sized, single trunked, upright-pyramidal deciduous tree. Smooth, gray-green bark with orange lenticels, not exfoliating. Highly resistant to Dutch Elm disease, and moderate resistance to the elm leaf beetle. Small leaves. Perfect for use in smaller landscapes, along city streets and under power lines. Tolerant of urban conditions. Zones 4-8.

***Ulmus japonica* 'Discovery', DISCOVERY ELM (35-40' tall x 35-40' spread)**

Plant patent #10558. This terrific cultivar was developed by Rick Durant of Manitoba, Canada. Highly resistant to Dutch Elm disease, it exhibits good cold hardiness and excellent vase-shaped form. Also resistant to elm leaf beetles, it's clean looking through the entire growing season. Own root. Yellow fall foliage color. Zones 3-6.

***Ulmus japonica x wilsoniana* 'Triumph', TRIUMPH ELM (55' tall x 45' spread)**

Also known as *Ulmus hybrid* 'Morton Glossy'. A good oval form and strong branching combine with disease and pest resistant foliage make this elm one of the better new Elms. Lustrous, dark green foliage in summer turns yellow in Autumn. Being a complex hybrid of three Asian species, this elm is able to grow over a wide range of climates. Zone 4-9.

***Ulmus parvifolia* 'Bosque', BOSQUE ELM (45' tall x 30' spread)**

Also known as *Ulmus parvifolia* 'UPMF'. Plant patent #11295. Bosque Elm is well shaped for planting on city streets and in restricted spaces, thanks to its upright growth habit and narrow crown. Fine textured, glossy, dark green foliage is complemented by multi-colored exfoliating bark. Yellow-orange fall foliage color. Zone 6.

***Ulmus parvifolia* 'Dynasty', DYNASTY CHINESE LACEBARK ELM (40' tall x 40' spread)**

A broadly rounded tree with fine textured foliage and good environmental tolerance. It tends to develop better fall color than is typical of the species. Orange-yellow fall foliage color. A National Arboretum introduction. Makes an ideal shade tree, specimen, for street or parking lot. Fast growing tree forms a graceful vase-shaped, spreading canopy of long, arching, somewhat weeping branches which are clothed with 2-3" long, shiny, dark green, leathery leaves which become transformed into various shades of red in the Autumn. Somewhat exfoliating, dark grey bark reveals random, mottled patterns of darker grey, green and occasionally, orange and brown. Full sun, partial sun to partial shade. Shows excellent resistance to Elm Leaf and Japanese Beetles. Zone 5.

***Ulmus parvifolia* 'Emer II', ALLEE CHINESE LACEBARK ELM (55-65' tall x 55' wide)**

Plant patent #7552. Discovered by Dr. Michael Dirr of University of Georgia, Athens. A beautiful large shade tree considered one of the finest replacements for the diseased American Elm. Upright, spreading form produces excellent shade for parks, boulevards, rural ranches and larger homesites. Attractive exfoliating bark creates a mosaic of orange, tan and gray, muted gold fall color. Resistant to Dutch Elm disease. Deciduous. Full sun. Medium to fast growth rate. Zone 5.

Ulmus parvifolia 'Emerald I', ATHENA CLASSIC LACEBARK ELM (30' tall x 35' wide)

Plant patent #7551. Broad spreading elm with a rounded crown. Deciduous. Leaves are lustrous dark green in summer and turn orange to brown in Autumn. The bark exfoliates from the ground in a puzzle-like pattern exposing the light gray and gray-green to orangish brown colors. Highly resistant to Dutch Elm disease and Elm Leaf Beetle. Partial to full sun. Prefers moderate to dry conditions. Shows no symptoms of leaf scorch. Zone 5-9.

Ulmus 'Morton Stalwart', COMMENDATION JAPANESE ELM (60' tall x 50' spread)

Tree has an oval canopy with good foliage quality forming an upright spreading form with symmetrical branching. Fast growing, but not wild, it is easier to maintain good form in the nursery than is the case with most elm cultivars. Tolerant to Dutch Elm disease. Yellow fall foliage color. Zone 5.

***Ulmus 'Patriot'*, PATRIOT ELM (50' tall x 40' spread)**

Introduced by the U. S. National Arboretum. This variety was bred and selected for its pest and disease tolerance and wide, vase-shaped crown. Fast growing and highly tolerant of Dutch Elm disease, it is easily established in the nursery or landscape. Great for use in parks, lawn or highway sites requiring a tree with exceptional vigor. Large dark green, serrate leaves average 4" long x 3" wide. Yellowish autumn color. Tolerates a wide variety of growing conditions, including poor or alkaline soils, salts and air pollution. Zones 4-7.

***Ulmus 'Pioneer'*, PIONEER ELM (50' tall x 50' spread)**

Introduced by the U.S.D.A. Nursery Crops Lab, Pioneer Elm is extremely vigorous and disease resistant. It forms a rounded, spreading crown suitable for parks and campus settings. A hybrid of *Ulmus glabra* x *Ulmus carpinifolia*. Dark green leaves turn yellow in Autumn. Tolerant of Dutch Elm Disease and phloem necrosis. Zone 5.
